Action Steps for Strategic Priorities

Facilitate exponential Christ-centered church growth—spiritual, discipleship, and numerical

We will double our annual growth rate to 3% by:

- Encouraging traditional and contemporary initiatives for soul winning and evangelism
- Providing adequate finances to resource churches/pastors for ministry
- Providing lay training in key ministry areas
- Establishing accountability— between churches and conference
- Growing healthy churches

Recruit, grow, equip, and empower strong Christian leaders

We will encourage churches and members to participate in initiatives such as Partners for Growth and Mission Driven Churches to:

FINANCING A WORLD CHURCH

PART ONE

Over the next several issues of *Mission Idaho Update*, join me as we look at the Biblical principles upon which the financial system of the Seventh-day Adventist® Church is built—tithe and the basic types of offerings collected within the Adventist Church and how the church uses them.

The first part of giving does not even involve money, it involves the heart and our attitude. 2 Corinthians 9:7 says, "...God loves a cheerful giver." In 2 Corinthians 8:5 it says, "...they did not do as we expected, but they gave themselves first to the

Lord and then to us in keeping with God's will." These texts show us that God wants our giving, whether it is giving of our time, talents, or treasures, to flow out of the joy we experience in our relationship with Him. As we spend time getting to know our Creator and Redeemer, His Spirit fills our lives. Our walk

with God gives us freedom from the condemnation sin and Satan want us to feel. Regardless of the path we are on, with Jesus in our lives we can experience hope and joy in the assurance of our salvation. It is out of this relationship and experience that God wants us to base our giving.

Texts such as Proverbs 3:9-10 and Acts 20:35 tell us there is a blessing in giving to God and our fellow mankind. I would like to share a few stories that have been shared with me about how God has blessed those who give. One time I shared at church how early on in my family, we returned tithe based on our gross income, then we decided maybe it would be OK to switch to returning tithe based on our take-home pay for a while. Certainly God would understand that we were a young family trying to get our home established. However, before long we realized that God was not blessing us as much as He had before the change and we made the choice to not only go back to the former

way, but to make up the difference. About a year after I shared that experience a building contractor pulled me aside. He told me he had heard what I shared and decided to try it with his business. Since he began the experiment his business had never had a lack for work and he decided never to go back to returning tithe only on his take-home amount.

Another individual once shared that while out of work he was to the point of only having the money he had set aside for tithe. He thought about

whether he should return his tithe on Sabbath or if this was something he should use for his own needs since he had nothing left. After giving his tithe at church a friend called him to do a job. When the job was done the friend asked how much he wanted to be paid, he told the friend he trusted him to be fair.

When this individual looked at the check it was for the exact amount he had given in tithe.

I invite you to begin, renew, or take your relationship with God to the next level. He loves you and desires nothing more than to have a friendship with you.

MISSION IDAHO UPDATE

10 + 10 FOR KIDS IS STILL ALIME AND GROWING



Seven years ago, 10+10 for Kids was launched to provide a way for everyone to help keep Adventist Education strong in the Idaho Conference. Since its inception 10+10 for Kids has been able to distribute almost \$75,000 to our schools.

It has been exciting to see how these funds have helped our schools across the Idaho and Eastern Oregon. The funds have helped kids stay in school, purchased equipment for science, computers, iPads, robots, Physical Education equipment and more. One school was able to use the funds to finish a much-needed restroom upgrade. How cool is it for students to step into a bright bathroom that is nice and fresh looking and not something out the 1960s! It just makes the day seem a lot brighter.

For those who don't what 10+10 for Kids is, let me tell you a little about it. 10+10 is a program that provides schools with funds that can be used for whatever they need and is building an endowment fund to help schools in the long run. The first 10 of 10+10 is returning your tithe to God and He will bless in ways that you need, ways that will be more important than cash in your pocket. Blessings of His Spirit's leading to be a blessing to others. The second 10 is just \$10 per month in the tithe envelope marked for 10+10 for Kids.

The money that comes in is given to three areas. Half of it is put into the 10+10 endowment fund. The other half is split evenly between Gem State Adventist Academy and the conference's elementary schools. This system is a great way for church members to contribute to keep our schools thriving for students going to them. 10 + 10 for Kids allows members whose church does not have a church school to impact the life of a student, both here and eternally.

Our schools are important because they provide a great education to their students. They also provide spiritual education and an Adventist worldview to understanding what is happening in our world. We want our children to become the young men and women that God wants to help lead our church and share the Good News of God's love and Christ's soon return.

If everyone in the conference would take up this opportunity to support our schools, our schools would be blessed beyond measure.

Today you can become a blessing to the children in the Idaho Conference. 10+10, you can make a difference for our kids.


